 $\sqrt{\text{Regarding the Question no 1 of SSS}}$ , 48 % and 38% student respondents are agreed with Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 respectively . As such a total of about 86 % students are commented in favour of Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 combined . Moreover 11% respondents agreed for Rating point 2 in this regard .

Regarding the Question no 2 of SSS, 52% and 47% student respondents agreed with Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 respectively. Thus a total of about 98% students are in favour of Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 combined.

Regarding the Question no 3 of SSS , 42% and 47% student respondents agreed with Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 respectively , thus covering about 89% students in total in case of Rating points 3 and 4 together . Moreover 10% respondents agreed for Rating point 2 in this regard .

Regarding the Question no 4 of SSS , 32 % and 29% student respondents are agreed with Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 respectively . As such a total of about 61 % students are commented in favour of Rating point 3 and Rating point 4 combined . Moreover 32% respondents agreed for Rating point 2 in this regard .










































































The IQAC of Dhemaji College has intimated the Result of SSS to all concerned and suggests certain measures to be followed towards further upgradation in this regard.
