"We the People of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a sovereign, socialist, secular, democratic republic and to ensure to all citizens:

Justice, social, economic and political:

Liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship:

Equality of status and opportunity and promote among them all:

Fraternity of assuring dignity of our individual and the unity and integrity of the nation:

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty sixth day of November, 1949 do hereby adopt, enact and give to ourselves this constitution."


